
EXPLORING THE TIMELINE OF PROPHETS IN PALESTINE








CHILDREN OF ISRAEL (BANI ISRAEL)

Take Prophet Ibrahim (Abraham) for example, he spent many years in Palestine, with his sons: Prophet Ishaq and grandson Prophet Yaqub (peace be upon him). Yaqub is also referred to as Israel, and he had 12 sons, including Prophet Yusuf (peace be upon him). But, life wasn't all that easy as Prophet Yusuf (peace be upon him) ended up in Egypt, along with his family. As part of destiny and Gods' greater plan, the Children of Israel moved to Egypt but later ended up as slaves. Until as per Allah's wise plan, He sent Prophet Musa (peace be upon him) to save the day! The miracle of parting of the Red Sea was a way out for them and off they went to the Sinai desert.



THE PLIGHT OF THE PROPHETS

Prophet Musa (peace be upon him) led his people through the Sinai desert for 40 years with the hope of reaching the Holy Land. However, he passed away before that could happen. Prophet Yusha (peace be upon him) took over Musa's mission and conquered the land with a devoted army. Truly, this is a land that has been graced by the footsteps of so many prophets!




"So her Lord (Allah) accepted her with goodly acceptance.

chamber) to (visit) her, he found her supplied with sustenance. He said:


"O Maryam! From where have you got this?" She said, "This is from Allah."

THE PLIGHT OF THE PROPHETS

During Prophet Isa's lifetime, many people didn't believe in him and plotted to kill him. Nevertheless, Allah intervened and saved him, with the assurance that he would eventually come back to the earth. All of this happened in Palestine.


A ONE-OF-A-KIND JOURNEY




THE NIGHT JOURNEY AND ASSCENSION (MIRAJ AL ISRA)

This was an incredible journey to Al Masjid Al Aqsa! This sacred site was not just any old spot, it held an extraordinary place in the Prophet's heart (peace be upon him) and was revered by other holy prophets too.

Before the second year of Hijra, he even faced this mosque during prayers. (Qibla) But, hold tight, because this really happened during the Isra and Mi'raj night journey. Riding atop a white beast named Buraq, the Prophet (peace be upon him) led a prayer session with all the previous prophets at Al Masjid Al Aqsa before soaring to the heavens. This epic journey was so extraordinary that God's divine signs forever commemorated it in the Quran.







THE FIRST DIRECTION FOR PRAYER (QIBLA)

Al Masjid Al Aqsa was the very first direction Muslims faced when praying. It was built 40 years after Al Masjid Al Haram in Makkah. Some say the wise Prophet Adam (peace be upon him), while others believe it was the legendary Prophet Ibrahim (peace be upon him). This special mosque has been rebuilt, renovated, and expanded many times throughout history.

40 YEARS BETWEEN

Abu Dhar (may Allah be pleased with him) narrated:

I said, "O Allah's Messenger! Which mosque was first built on the surface of the earth?" He said, "Masjid al-Haram." I said, "Which was built next?" He replied "The mosque of Al-Aqsa." I said, "What was the period of construction between the two?" He said, "Forty years." He added, "Wherever (you may be, and) the prayer time becomes due, perform the prayer there, for this is the best thing to do. (offer the prayers on time).








THREE SPECIAL MOSQUES TO VISIT!


This masjid has a special place in Muslim hearts, being the second mosque built 40 years after the Kabah.

It's even mentioned in the Quran, with Allah Himself calling it "Blessed" and "Holy".

According to Islamic teachings, visiting three special mosques is recommended for every believer: Masjid Al-Haram in Makkah, Al Masjid An-Nabawi in Madinah, and Masjid Al-Aqsa in Jerusalem. Prayers in these special spots are mega-powerful, with worshippers getting much more times the reward of Salah performed elsewhere!




"Glorified be He [Allah] Who did take His servant for a journey by night from Al Masjid Al Haram to Al Masjid Al Aqsa, whose precincts We did bless, in order that We might show him some of our Signs. Verily He is the All Hearing, All Seeing."



THE PUREST PRAY TOGETHER

Their first stop was in far-off Jerusalem. Imagine flying on a winged horse through the night sky! Once they arrived, something remarkable occurred. The Prophet (peace be upon him) led a prayer with other prophets from the past. It was like a reunion of the beautiful prophets (peace be upon them) all praying in peace and harmony together. This symbolises how all the prophets bought one key message to worship in unity the One God. It also shows us how Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) is the leader of the Prophets, best in character in example for mankind.

But the spiritual adventure didn't end there. Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) and Gabriel continued their journey through the heavens. THE MAJESTIC PRAYER IS PRESCRIBED



UMAR IBN AL KHATTAB - A LEGEND!

When the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) passed, Umar Ibn Al Khattab was ready to step up and lead the way. In 637/638 AD, Umar and his crew of 40,000 sahaba answered the call to Jerusalem by the Christian leader. But instead of wielding weapons, they brought with them open hearts and minds, protecting lives, resources, and sacred sites.

Yet, when they arrived at the holy grounds, they were met with a heap of rubble left by the Romans. Well, Umar didn't shy away from a challenge! He rolled up his sleeves and got to work, clearing the debris. Soon, the reconstruction of Al Masjid Al Aqsa was underway, and both Jews and Christians welcomed the Muslims with open arms. There wasn't any war, because the people of Jerusalem surrendered to them. Umar (may God be pleased with him) also was given the key to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, to this day it is held in custody of a Muslim family. he would protect the rights of Christians.



ABDUL MALIK BIN MARWAN

Fast forward to 691/692 AD, when Abdul Malik bin Marwan had a bright idea - he wanted to build the Dome of the Rock atop the holy rock where Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) had ascended to the heavens. Regardless of its significance, the rock became an essential part of Al Masjid Al Aqsa area and still stands as a symbol of faith and hope to this day.

The special rock is located inside the Dome of the Rock, where the accession occurred.





HISTORY TAKES A TURN


History took a turn for the worse when the Crusaders took over Al Masjid Al Aqsa in 1099 AD. The aftermath was a horror show as thousands of people sought safety within the walls of this holy sanctuary. The Crusaders transformed the blessed Masjid into a lavish palace, which lasted for 88 long years of Muslim absence.

But, all was not lost, as the hero of our story stepped in with a cape and a plan in 1187. Our hero, Salahuddin Ayyubi, was a force to be reckoned with. Like a modern-day Umar Ibn Al Khattab, he spared all innocent civilians and reclaimed Al Masjid Al Aqsa.



THE HUB OF FAITH AND KNOWLEDGE

For eight centuries, Muslims ruled over Jerusalem and Al Masjid Al Aqsa, creating a time of peace, justice, and prosperity. Scholars from all over the world came to learn, and People of the Book found safety and respect.





OTTOMAN EMPIRE UP UNTIL 1918

Let's take a trip down memory lane. For centuries, during the Ottoman caliphate, the city of Jerusalem and Al Masjid Al Aqsa were treated with respect, and Muslims were in charge of running the city.


They followed the Islamic law which also ensured religious freedom and security for the Jewish and Christian minorities. But then came the Zionist movement, which had an aim to create a Jewish state in Muslim Palestinian land, and was supported by the British. There was an important letter called the Balfour Declaration which explains what happened.




THE HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY OF PALESTINE






THIS IS A MODEL AND MAY NOT BE TO EXACT DIMENSIONS AND DISTANCE
